Shingle Creek Neighborhood Garden Sites



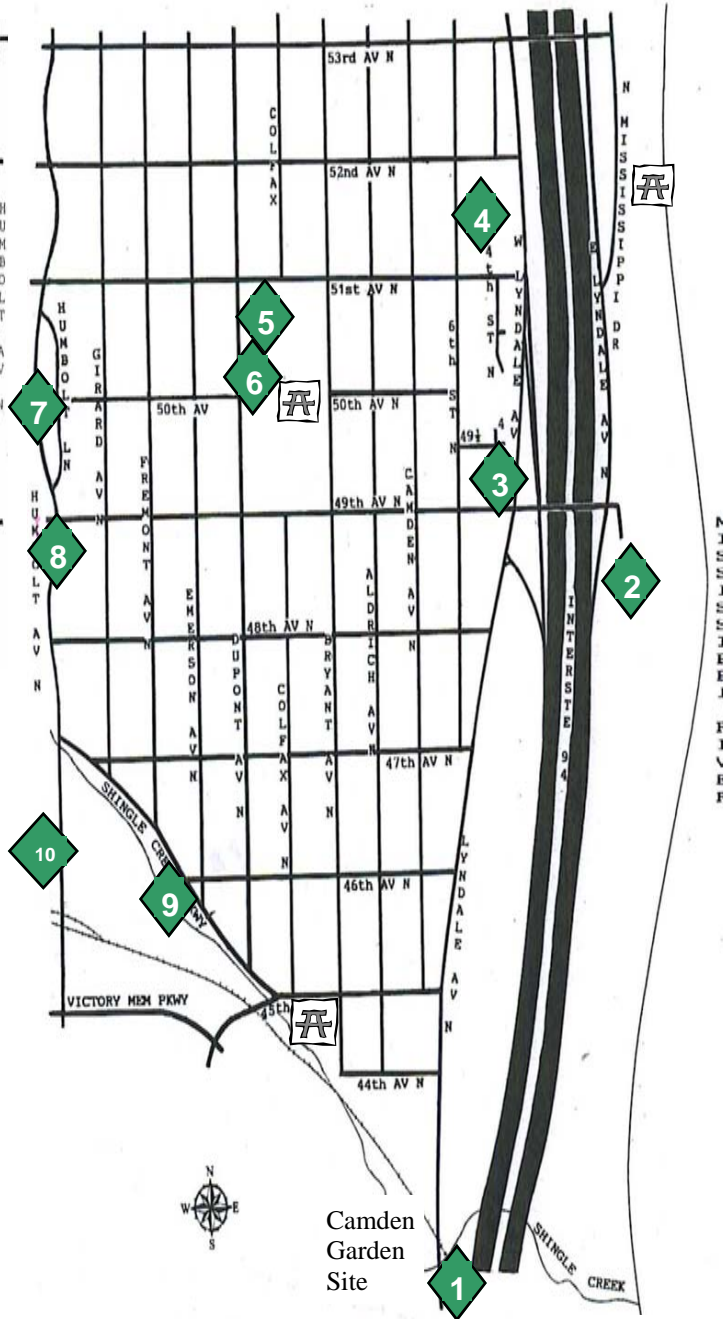
1. Common Ground Community Garden: This garden at 52nd and Newton has MN natural grasses and is a favorite peaceful corner garden site for strolling and picnics.



2. Children's Forest at 52nd and Queen is an open field along the Shingle Creek and bike path with especially planted trees in the late 1990's.



3. Shingle Creek Regional Ponds: 52nd and Upton is the starting point to see flora and fauna abounding around these two small filter ponds, stroll this path & discover a whole new neighborhood asset!

Garden Sites:



1. Camden Garden 42nd and Lyndale is a showcase garden in the neighborhood! Start tour here!



2. North Mississippi Regional Park and Carl Kroening Interpretive Center have a Prairie Restoration project at the park and a pavilion for weekend picnics with the family and friends along the shores of the Mississippi River!



3. Lyndale Gateway Garden at 49th and Lyndale is a frolicking splashes of color and natural prairie grasses to welcome visitors and neighbors to the neighborhood.



4. George Hill and Alice Rainville (GHAR) Park at 52nd Ave N and 6th St N once the backyard of the Workhouse grounds in the early 1900's, this park has new trees and wide-open greenspace for residents to enjoy.



5 & 6. Jenny Lind School Butterfly park and Sign gardens Two gardens on the school grounds are highlighted throughout the school year as outdoor classroom learning sites.



7. Maple Leaf and Humboldt Heights: "The Country" on Humboldt Ave N are surrounded by local history and flowers.



8 & 9. Shingle Creek Circle Gardens These circle gardens along the Shingle Creek pathway are elevated gardens with color and fragrance.



10. Humboldt Ave N Gateway Designed by UofM, owned by CP Rail, this space once housed a warehouse, its now lined with pine trees to buffer the industrial area behind.
